MINISTER'S LETTER

From Christmas to Easter

It is always a little strange but in the church calendar we go from Christmas -celebrating Jesus' birth - to Good Friday and Easter at seemingly breakneck speed. It depends on when Easter falls, but within 3 months the baby Jesus is grown up, arrested and hangs dead on a cross. The gospels don't have a lot of information on what Jesus' childhood and young adult years where like. We don't really hear of him again until he is approximately 30 years old and commences his itinerant ministry of preaching, teaching and healing.

I usually focus on one of the Gospels in my preaching in the services between Christmas and Easter. This year, I will be looking at Matthew's gospel, and I hope you will join in, by attending our services, and by reading through Matthew's gospel yourself in your devotional time. A book I recommend for this is 'Matthew for everyone' by Tom Wright, in it he gives his own accessible translation of a passage followed by a very relatable explanation/reflection. The series has sometimes been compared with William Barclay's very popular series from the 50s and 60s 'the Daily Study Bible'. It can also still be bought. Each gospel writer has ordered the material that they had about Jesus' life in a particular way – for Matthew his main aim is to show to a predominantly Jewish readership that Jesus really is God's promised Messiah, come to set the people and the world free from sin and to establish the reign of God.

This is truly good news – or gospel – not just 2000 years ago, but also in 2020. As we pray each week, thy (God's) kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven.

CHURCHES OF THE WORLD

St Mary's Basilica Gdansk – Poland



In the Haneatic city of Gdansk can be found this majestic church.
This is believed to be the largest Lutheran brick church in the world. It can hold over 25,000 people! (this had been useful during a period of martial law between 1981 and 1983 when members of the Solidarity movement sought refuge here).

Construction began in 1370. When you enter this church, the size is quite arresting and overwhelming, you feel quite humbled. There are over 37

large windows. The sculptor who carved the crucifix of Christ seemingly nailed his errant son-in-law to a cross to add realism to his work.

St Mary's was seriously damaged during World War 11 and the original frescoes were all whitewashed over to protect them with the result the pillars where they were painted seemed quite Spartan since they have never been recovered. There is a huge astronomical clock dating from 1464. It shows the time and date, phases of the moon, position of the moon in relation to the zodiac signs and the calendar of saints. Adam and Eve ring the bell on the hour!

It also has a massive 78 metre high tower but we had no time to explore this (405 steps!)



And this is yet another church which has the graves underneath the original floors instead of outside the church. 300 graves are embedded in the stonework here.
